«Top of the West Ranch Horse Sale: The Boosters hold an annual horse sale including consignment ranch horses and horses which have been donated to MSU Colt Breaking and Training Classes by producers not only from around Montana, but beyond. Students in MSU training courses have worked with these animals for 2 semesters. Consigned horses may have portions of the proceeds donated to the Equine Boosters. By purchasing a horse at the sale, you are supporting the Equine Boosters of MSU and the Equine Science program at Montana State University.

«Donate a Horse: Montana Horse Company, White Sulphur Springs, originated the “Donate a Horse” program to build support for the MSU Equine Science program by giving students the “hands on” opportunity to learn the science, economics and skills needed to train and market horse. Support the MSU Equine Program while promoting your business by donating a quality horse to the Training Class Horse Sale.

«Consign a Horse: Consigners may choose to donate 25%, 50%, 75% or 100% of the proceeds from their ranch horses back to the Equine Boosters of MSU. Consigners may also choose to set their own percentage or specific cash amount for donation back to the program.
